5. $\int \frac{x^4}{x^2-1} dx$

6. $\int 35 \sin^4 x \cos^3 x dx$

7. $\int_0^{1/3} \sqrt{1-9t^2} dt$

Trigonometric Identities

Addition and subtraction formulas

- $\sin(x + y) = \sin x \cos y + \cos x \sin y$
- $\sin(x - y) = \sin x \cos y - \cos x \sin y$
- $\cos(x + y) = \cos x \cos y - \sin x \sin y$
- $\cos(x - y) = \cos x \cos y + \sin x \sin y$
- $\tan(x + y) = \frac{\tan x + \tan y}{1 - \tan x \tan y}$
- $\tan(x - y) = \frac{\tan x - \tan y}{1 + \tan x \tan y}$

Double-angle formulas

- $\sin(2x) = 2 \sin x \cos x$
- $\cos(2x) = \cos^2 x - \sin^2 x = 2 \cos^2 x - 1 = 1 - 2 \sin^2 x$
- $\tan(2x) = \frac{2 \tan x}{1 - \tan^2 x}$

Half-angle formulas

- $\sin^2 x = \frac{1 - \cos(2x)}{2}$
- $\cos^2 x = \frac{1 + \cos(2x)}{2}$

Others

- $\sin A \cos B = \frac{1}{2}[\sin(A - B) + \sin(A + B)]$
- $\sin A \sin B = \frac{1}{2}[\cos(A - B) - \cos(A + B)]$
- $\cos A \cos B = \frac{1}{2}[\cos(A - B) + \cos(A + B)]$
